### **How to Play Sudoku?**

Sudoku does not require any calculation or arithmetic skills. It is a easy a game of placing numbers in squares. It can be played by almost any one and the rules of sudoku are very simple to learn.

#### **Sudoku Objective**

The objective of the game is to fill all the blank squares with the correct numbers. There are three very simple rules to follow. In a 9 by 9 square Sudoku game (a traditional game):

- Every row of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every column of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order
- Every 3 by 3 Square within the 9 by 9 square must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order

Every Sudoku games begins with some of squares already filled in. The difficulty of each game is determine of how many squares are filled in. The more squares that are known, the easier it is to figure out which numbers go in the open squares. As you fill in squares correctly, options for the remaining squares are narrowed and it becomes easier to find them.
